RECOMENDATIONS

The student body recommends to the university that the promote the adoption of low cost and no cost resources by engaging with the faculty to encourage their use in curricula. These low cost and no cost resources are also known as OER's which the student body have been experiencing a lack thereof as most instructors or professors would sometimes not list such access to resources, hence, the student body recommends that the university encourage these instructors work along with the OER department to provide the necessary resources for students.

STUDENT NEED

The student has been experiencing a lack of accessible resources (OER's) a require this resource in order to properly pursue their academics. Furthermore, OER relieves the financial burden on students who do not have the necessary funds to obtain resources such as textbooks for their classes. The student body requires instructors, faculty, and professors to work with the OER department to better assist student in pursuing their academics as the have an efficient resource to access free and or low-cost textbooks for their courses.

PROCESS

This resolution came up multiple times as two of our senators had submitted similar resolutions. In order to not be repetitive, I combined the two resolutions and introduced it to the academic affairs committee. The committee was highly interested in this resolution and conducted thorough research to understand the underlying issue with the OER's and determine if there needs to be either improvements or an increase access to these resources. After this research the committee amended and passed this resolution which the general body unanimously passed.

RESEARCH

The committee conducted research by reaching out to administration and other institutions that provide OER's. The committee emailed and contacted Follet Higher Education which gave unput and answered our questions regarding OER's and how the system works. This led the committee to meet with Paul Beaulieu and interview them with how the bookstore provides OER's and how can this resolution better suit the needs for students who are experiencing any difficulties with OER's. Moreover, the committee interviewed and met with Megan Zara, OER librarian, and John Wang, Dean of Libraries, who helped the committee get a better understanding of how our OER department works along with what they provide to the student. This meeting helped the committee as it shared insight on where the OER department needed

support.

RESULTS

The Academic Affairs Committee felt that this resolution would assist the OER department in encouraging faculty, instructors, and professors increase access to low-cost or no cost textbook resources for their students. (7-0-0)

The Student Senate found that the committee conducted adequate research and noticed that the OER is working towards increasing their accessible resources, so in turn the general body would like to lend a hand in their efforts and give their support. (25-0-0)

CERTIFICATION

Resolution 25-04 was passed by the Student Senate on March 4th , 2025, under the procedure given by Section 3.2 of the Bylaws.

I would like to first introduce myself, my name is Carson Clayton and I am a member of the student government for our UTA campus. Recently our team came across a resolution we would like to see implemented in our campus however before we move forward with this project we need to gather the necessary information to find out the feasibility of our resolution. I have attached the resolution below so anyone can review it and suggest changes.

The main reason for this email is to get a few questions answered for our upcoming meeting that were suggested by our committee members.

- **What is the current process for obtaining e-books and OER's and how is it different from obtaining physical copies of the books?**
- **Does the bookstore currently offer OER's and if not would the bookstore consider offering OER's?**
- **What would it cost the University to offer the following scenarios:**
 - **Only offering online resources and no longer providing physical materials for students for all classes excluding situations where physical materials are necessary? Ex: Chemistry Lab Book**
 - **Only offering Physical resources and no longer providing online resources excluding situations where online materials are necessary?**
 - **Offering both online and physical materials sufficient that every student would have the ability to choose whether to utilize an online or physical resource for any class excluding situations where the preference is not possible?**
- **Why is there an expiration date on most Online Resources like textbooks and what is the standard designation expiration for when said resource can no longer be utilized?**
- **What are our current partners for our online resources for e-books and OER's and what companies do we not partner with and why?**

When it is possible I would like to meet with someone from the UTA bookstore to get these questions answered and so that I can easily ask follow up questions and obtain clarification when necessary.

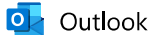

I appreciate the opportunity for further partnership. As outlined in the Texas Education Code, library fees are designated for library resources and relevant services. Since my arrival, we have been strategically aligning our resources toward collections, programs, and services. We view the Student Government as a vital partner in this journey, and I would love to learn more about the resolution and its next steps.

In the meantime, I will need to gather specifics to address some of your questions from my colleagues. At a high level, we license and purchase e-books from various publishers and provide Open Access e-books to students and faculty whenever available at no cost. When permitted by copyright, we also digitize high-value, high-risk, and high-demand materials. Additionally, we operate a course reserve service to circulate copyrighted materials for students enrolled in specific courses.

If I understand the resolution correctly, it focuses on textbooks and course reading materials. We also manage an Open Educational Resources (OER) program, which collaborates with faculty to develop free and low-cost learning materials. You can learn more about it: <https://libraries.uta.edu/dept/oerds>.

Our overarching goal is to systematically enhance the affordability of student learning. The library's above initiatives play a key role in this effort, and we are actively seeking synergies among partners to maximize the impact of these services. The timing of this resolution is excellent, and I look forward to learning more about it.

Hope you are well. Here is the summary of the main points I heard from the meeting with the OER director on Friday. She will be in our next committee meeting to discuss more.

1. OER- Faculty chooses materials and can make modifications.
2. The Library gives grants to faculty on OER.
3. Inclusive access is managed by departments/provost.
4. The library cannot get more deals on e-books.
5. There is a state freeze on increasing school fees.
6. McGrawhill, cengage and similar are not likely to work with the library.

Bookstore is powered by follett. They are run by another organization that connects them with the University. Greg Hladik Executive Director of Auxiliary Services. (day to day contact with library)

- 1) Ebooks can be obtained from the bookstore/website/amazon or any other ecommerce retailer. OER's when they are digital can be obtained through Canvas or through link in the course syllabus. Sometimes materials are included within the fees and they are a separate line item fee.
 - Inclusive access saves anywhere between 10 and 40 percent materials are included.
 - Equitable access is a program in which all materials and supplies are included in tuition or as a course fee with everything being provided at a reduced price. Where you may pay an additional 30\$ per credit hour (varies by university)

- 2) OER's are free. There is no reason for the University to provide that if it is already free. American YAWP by Locke is an example of an OER. If you want print then you need to buy it. History 1301 and 1302
- 3) Instructors have academic freedom to choose which materials and textbooks are required for their course. So there is no way that the book store could help with offering different e-course material if the instructor or professor chooses course material that is incompatible with ebooks. They offer it for those that can offer it. President
- 4) Publishers make the decisions regarding when the expiration happens. The people that the Bookstore works with are
120, 180, 360, lifetime depending on how much you want to pay or what is offered\ Expiration does not start until you open the book. I may need to get more information about the subscription.
- 5) We do business with like 900 publishes
McGrawhill, Cengage, Pearson, Elsevier that do digital
